### 1 Accounting policies

### 1.1 Accounting convention

### 1.3 Turnover

Turnover represents grants receivable and the amount derived from the provision of goods and services which fall within the company's ordinary activities.

### 1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
